ORDER

For the reasons stated in the Memorandum Opinion issued on October 15, 2018, ECF No. 86, the Court has reviewed, *in camera*, the 60 documents for which the Respondents have shown sufficient need to overcome the presidential communications privilege.

After *in camera review*, the Court finds that the following 37 documents are reasonably relevant to the claims at issue in Respondents' case: 72, 84, 94, 275, 593, 596, 599, 601, 603, 605, 627, 629, 631, 633, 668, 670, 758, 759, 763, 764, 765, 766, 767, 770, 849, 856, 859, 860, 863, 948, 950, 956, 1006, 1089, 1091, 1094, and 1152. See *In re Sealed Case*, 121 F.3d 729, 762 (D.C.

Cir. 1997) ("On remand, the district court should identify and release specific items of evidence that might reasonably be relevant to the grand jury's investigation into the potential false statements charge.") Accordingly, it is hereby,

ORDERED that Treasury shall **PRODUCE** the foregoing documents to the Respondents **FORTHWITH**.
