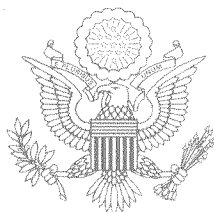

Dear Chairman Miller:

On December 2, 2009, the Subcommittee on Health, Employment, Labor, and Pensions held a hearing entitled, "Examining the Delphi Bankruptcy's Impact on Workers and Retirees." That hearing raised more questions than it answered regarding the role of the Treasury Department, the Presidential Task Force on the Auto Industry, and the White House in the disparate treatment of pension benefits for Delphi workers and retirees. Unfortunately, no Administration witnesses were called to testify at the hearing, leaving the Subcommittee incapable of conducting proper oversight.


We subsequently requested documents from Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner in a letter dated December 7, 2009 to permit this Committee to perform its oversight duties. To date, the Secretary has failed to respond in any fashion. A December 18, 2009 letter from Subcommittee Ranking Member Tom Price to Subcommittee Chairman Rob Andrews seeking a second hearing on the Delphi matter with witnesses called from the Administration has similarly gone unheeded.


We therefore request that you immediately subpoena all relevant documents related to the disparate treatment of Delphi workers' pension benefits by this Administration. Under clause 2(m)(3)(A)(i) of Rule XI of the Rules of the House of Representatives and Committee Rule 9 of the Rules of the Committee on Education and Labor, the power to issue subpoenas on behalf of the Committee has been delegated to you as Chairman. This Committee cannot perform its oversight duties unless you use your subpoena power to compel the Administration to

immediately provide the Committee a copy of all documents and correspondence relating to the federal government's involvement in the restructuring of General Motors and Delphi's pension plans, including all documents relating to communications among the Auto Task Force, the Department of the Treasury, the White House, General Motors Corporation, Delphi Corporation, the Pension Benefit Guarantee Corporation, the UAW, and other organized labor unions.

Thank you for your consideration of our request.
