Dear Secretary Lew:

I write today in support of the Delphi Salaried Retirees Association and the more than 20,000 affected Delphi salaried retirees they represent. As you are aware, during the recent General Motors bankruptcy proceedings the Delphi salaried employees lost upwards of 70 percent of their earned pension and benefits. I have tremendous concerns about the impact this is having on the retirees and their families, particularly those who live in Michigan's Fifth Congressional District.

My understanding is that the Association sent a proposal for restoring these benefits to President Obama last year. Enclosed you will find a copy of that settlement proposal. I would ask that you meet with the Association to consider possible solutions for these retirees and their families.

The retirees' steadfast dedication to the company and their years of hard work should have resulted in a pension and benefits. Rather, it has led to years of economic hardship and stress. I urge you to do all you can to bring about an equitable resolution for these retirees and their families.
